Catalpa	<i>Catalpa spp.</i>	Messy fruit, poor form
Boxelder	<i>Acer negundo</i>	Weak wood, poor form
Silver Maple	<i>Acer saccharinum</i>	Weak wood, poor form
Willow	<i>Salix spp.</i>	Weak wood, poor form
Spruce	<i>Picea spp.</i>	Visibility obstruction
Pine	<i>Pinus spp.</i>	Visibility obstruction
Fir	<i>Abies spp.</i>	Visibility obstruction
