## History

The history of aviation in Michigan City dates back to the 1930s when several aviation enthusiasts started the Michigan City Flying Field. In 1932, the Dunes Aircraft Corporation, known as the Doodlebug Flying Club, was started. In 1945 Michigan City formed it's first Board of Aviation Commissioners. In 1948 a site on the south side of Michigan City was selected for an airport, and a 2,400 ft x 60 ft sod runway was constructed. The city received four grants from the FAA to build an administration building and pave the runway.



The city sold the Michigan City Flying Field in 1985. In 1986 the Michigan City Board of Aviation Commissioners acquired Phillips Field, on US20/35 the site of the present Michigan City Municipal Airport.

Plans are in place to extend the runway and taxiway, install security fencing, and build a new terminal building by 2008.

## Location

Michigan City, Indiana is located in the southern shores of Lake Michigan and adjacent to the Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore and State Park. The city, which is located in the northernmost part of LaPorte County, is only 55 miles east of Chicago and 10 miles southwest of the Michigan state line. The city's economy is diversified, featuring a sound industrial base accompanied by strong retail service and tourist sectors. The community is also extremely well oriented to the Chicago area, which is America's second largest market. Our central location between Chicago and other leading industrial and consumer markets of the Midwest makes Michigan City a natural production and distribution center.
