Graffiti Eradication Efforts Continue

Michigan City, IN – As part of Michigan City's continuing efforts to eradicate graffiti, Mayor Chuck Oberlie announced today that citizens who discover graffiti on their property can contact the city for assistance:

“Members of Michigan City's Graffiti Removal Program have been focusing their efforts on Phase III of the program, which includes the following neighborhoods: the area north of Michigan Boulevard to Springland and between Woodland and Roeske Avenues; the downtown Franklin Square Area; Elston Grove; Krueger Neighborhood; and the area surrounding Elston Middle School.

The efforts of the team involve contacting property owners to obtain signed consent forms allowing Vector Control staff to physically enter onto private property and remove graffiti from private structures.

Within the Phase III area, six property owners have provided signed release forms, allowing the graffiti removal to proceed. Additionally, one garage with graffiti was structurally marginal and the garage will be removed at no charge to the owner.

As the Michigan City Police Department is canvassing the city for 'Junk and Abandoned Vehicles' and multiple City Departments are collaborating on the City-wide 'Spring Cleanup' initiative, now is the perfect time for residents to check their properties for signs of graffiti. Any observed graffiti locations can be reported to the Central Services Department (873-1500) or the Mayor's Office (873-1400) for follow-up by the Graffiti removal Team.”
