- WHEREAS:** Emergencies can occur at anytime that require police, fire or emergency medical services; and
- WHEREAS:** when an emergency occurs the prompt response of police officers, firefighters and paramedics is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and
- WHEREAS:** the safety of our police officers, firefighters and paramedics is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who telephone the La Porte County 911 Communication Center; and
- WHEREAS:** public safety call telecommunicators are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with emergency services; and
- WHEREAS:** public safety telecommunicators are the single vital link for our police officers, firefighters and paramedics by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information and insuring their safety; and
- WHEREAS:** public safety telecommunicators of the La Porte County 9-1-1 Communication Center have contributed substantially to the apprehension of criminals, suppression of fires and treatment of patients; and
- WHEREAS:** each telecommunicator has exhibited compassion, understanding and professionalism during the performance of their job in the past year.

NOW, THEREFORE; I, CHARLES E. OBERLIE, Mayor of the City of Michigan City in the State of Indiana, do hereby proclaim the week of April 6th through 12th as:
