Safe Harbor facilitates organized activities that include exercise, sports, games, arts and crafts and field trips to children ages 6 through 12 in a summer program held at two locations— Knapp School and Memorial Hall— from June 8 through August 6.

The summer program builds values and friendships, provides educational experiences and teaches teamwork through programming. Safe Harbor collaborates with the Michigan City Parks & Recreation Department, the Michigan City Public Library, and the Lubeznik Center for the Arts.

Safe Harbor summer day camp participants will learn soccer during clinics provided by the Michigan City Parks & Recreation Department; an “end of summer” soccer challenge will bring children from all Michigan City summer camps together to showcase their new skills.

The children will visit the Michigan City Public Library each week, learning new things from the Youth Services librarians while choosing books to read for the library’s Summer Reading Program for which they can win prizes.

Swimming lessons and free swim time will be provided at the MCAS pool in the “Old Elston” building; lifeguards are provided by the Michigan City Parks & Recreation Department.

Safe Harbor summer camp participants will use buses provided by the Michigan City Area School System to go to the library and the pool.

Safety is a primary educational topic at the Safe Harbor summer camp. Guest speakers include the Michigan City Police and Fire Departments, the Washington Park lifeguard squad, and staffers from The Bike Stop. These professionals talk about helmet use and bicycle safety, lake/water safety, and other topics that educate our children about keeping safe in today’s world. All Safe Harbor staff members are trained in CPR, first aid, universal precautions and behavioral management skills.
